September Meeting Minutes

Date: September 12, 2023

Chairman Gile called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

All board members were present.

Pledge of Allegiance

Verification of posting in 3 places

Previous month's minutes were read. Supervisor 1, Carol Johnson made a motion to accept the August 2023 minutes. Supervisor 2, Will Scholze 2nd the motion. Motion was carried.

Treasurer report was read. Chairman Gile made a motion to accept this month's bills starting with check number 16146 through number 16175, including all E-Pays. Supervisor 2, Will Scholze 2nd the motion. Motion was carried.

Reports & Correspondence from Officers:

- Chairman Gile introduced correspondence received from Green Mountain International LLC, informing of services they are able to provide to the Town.

Agenda items:

- a) Rod & Gun – Dennis Hardwick proposes that the Rod & Gun Club utilize the old unused portion of the dump as a shooting range. The Town would not be responsible for any funds towards this project. The Rod & Gun Club would pay for everything. Dennis would like the Board's blessing to dig deeper into the idea of leasing the property from the Town for that purpose. Chairman Gile will reach out to the Town's attorney and insurance company about the possibility of this idea, and the requirements needed.
- b) Increased Police Coverage – Currently the Town pays \$530.00 per month for 10 hours of professional police services. Chairman Gile made a motion to increase the coverage to \$795.00 for 15 hours of police services per month. Supervisor 1, Carol Johnson 2nd the motion. Motion was carried.
- c) Neighborhood Watch – There was open discussion of issues at the old Scoville property on Stuve Road regarding ordinance violations. Jennifer Dutton will

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be the point of contact for the Neighborhood Watch. The Neillsville Police Chief, Jim Mankowski, can be reached at 715-743-3122.

- d) Sidewalk Updates – The sidewalk project in front of the Town Hall is almost ready to put out for bid. This agenda item is tabled for the November meeting. This project probably will not take place until spring of 2024.

Open discussion:

The cutting of the trees on Square Road has been completed, however there is still clean up to be done.

Chairman Gile stated the Legion gave the go ahead to start on the flag pole project.

The cleaning of culverts on private driveways is the responsibility of the owner.

Chairman Gile adjourned the meeting at 8:00 p.m.
